



Voter Registration Legal Overview

Who Can Register

To register to vote in Arizona, you must meet the following qualifications:

- Be a United States Citizen
- Be a resident of Arizona and the county listed on your registration
- Be 18 years or older by Election Day

You cannot register in Arizona if:

- You have been convicted as a felon and not had your civil rights restored
- You have been adjudicated incompetent

Arizona Voter Registration Form

Required Fields

- Full Name
- Street Address, City, Zip
- Last 4 digits of Social Security Number
- Proof of Citizenship
- Date of Birth
- Affirmations
- Signature and Date

Proof of Citizenship

To register to vote using the Arizona Voter Registration Form, you must provide proof of citizenship. The following items can be used to provide proof of citizenship on the form:

- Arizona Driver License or Non-operating Identification issued post 10/1/1996 in box 9
- Bureau of Indian Affairs Number, Indian Census number, Tribal Treaty Card Number, or Tribal Enrollment Number in box 11
- Alien Registration Number off of Naturalization Certificate in box 10

If a voter does not have any of the documents listed above, they may submit a photocopy of their birth certificate or passport along with their voter registration form.

PEVL

Voters may be added to the Permanent Early Voter List (PEVL) when they register to vote by checking “Yes” in box 1 of the form.

Registering to Vote Online

Voters with a valid Arizona Driver’s License can register online at servicearizona.com.

Federal Voter Registration Form

Federal law allows citizens to register for federal elections without providing documentary proof of citizenship. An applicant can register with the federal VR form with the last four digits of their Social Security Number. If an applicant fills out a federal VR form, they are only eligible to vote in federal elections (President, US House, US Senate).
